## New acquisition: Yang Yongliang, *Mountains of Crowds*, 2016

We are delighted to announce an award of £10,000 from Art Fund to support the acquisition of *Mountains of Crowds*, 2016, by Yang Yongliang.

<u>Mountains of Crowds</u> is a video that at first glance shows serene natural waterfalls and mountaintops, typical in traditional Chinese landscape painting, which on closer inspection, are formed of moving towering housing blocks and over-crowded streets.

Yang Yongliang was recently featured in <u>Digital Matters</u> exhibition at Centre for Chinese Contemporary Art (CFCCA) curated by joint Research Curator Marianna Tsionki.





# PRESENCE: A Window into Chinese Contemporary Art exhibition and final tour

If you haven't caught the *PRESENCE* exhibition now is your last chance to do so as it closes on Sunday 3 June.

The exhibition is a counterpoint to the <u>Terracotta Warriors</u> on display at World Museum – it showcases artworks by 19 artists from China, Hong Kong, Taiwan and the diaspora. Some of these are based on traditional Chinese art forms such as paper cuts and landscape painting – but with a modern twist. Other works vary from a zombie film to a sculpture of a shoe for a bird made by a former John Moores Painting Prize (China) winner! The exhibition is full of surprises, however the same age old themes of communication, love, death and power that are told in the Terracotta Warriors exhibition are also prevalent here – not much has changed in over 2000 years!
